## Motivations, Inc.

**SUMMARY:** This 2 day course will discuss the concepts of the physical care and evidence based principals to create results in clinical interventions for stroke, hemiplegia, brain injury, spasticity and general motor control issues. The course will focus on preception and oculomotor deficit remediation and compensation after a neurological event.

Hemiparesis handling made easy with a focus on the core in lab work. Lecture information will cover spasticity, UE/LE treatment, and pusher strategies. Lab work will cover facilitations, stretching, a technology lab for neuro rehabilitation function analysis, and midline shift dysfunction (pusher). Functional applications of improvement and carryover of care will be addressed as well as documentation to advocate for a client. The Vision Rehabilitation lab portions will cover ocular motor, visual field, and neglect testing. Functional treatment interventions will be discussed for each of the impairments. Occupational and physical therapists and assistants will find this course to be heavily lab based to provide attendees with skills for immediately use for effective strategies in the clinic. Documentation and advocacy for the client with consideration to the payor is also discussed.

**PRESENTER: MICHELLE MIODUSZEWSKI, MS, OTR/L**, has been practicing occupational therapy since 2000 in acute, inpatient rehabilitation, and outpatient settings. She also consults for legal, education, and professional situations. Since her thesis work focused on the impact of FIM testing for the patient with a CVA in the CMS PPS, she has made the pointed effort to work with the neurological population. Currently, Ms. Mioduszewski owns and operates Niagara Therapy, LLC, a team-oriented practice based in Erie, PA that offers OT, PT, and SLP to adults and children with neurological concerns. She is the AOTA Administration and Management Chairperson for the Rehabilitation and Disability Special Interest Section, National MS Society Board of Trustees, and is a National MS Society Partner in Care Designation. She also owns and operates Niagara Therapy Professional Services, LLC and Niagara Properties, LLC. A graduate of D'Youville College in Buffalo, NY, she was the youngest person to receive the Delta Sigma Award from the Marguerite D'Youville College Honor Society. In 2017 she was named 40 under 40 by the Erie Reader. Ms. Mioduszewski was trained in NDT and NEURO-IFRAH (NDTC), Bioness Certified, REO Certified, SAEBO Certified, and specialized in vision and cognitive rehabilitation. A published writer by AOTA Press, she also teaches on topics such as IASTM, Neuro-Rehab/Neuro-Handling, vision, cognition, spasticity, ergonomics and complex wheelchair evaluations. - 4. Define principals of neuro handling and facilitation
- 5. Demonstration of facilitation of the pelvis, spine and scapula
- 6. Demonstration of stretch of pelvis, scapula, and hand
- 7. Demonstration of Midline Shift Syndrome treatments
- 8. Discuss functional hemiparesis treatments and spasticity rehab principals
- 9. Define documentation to advocate for your patient and document progress
